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Chapter 1

Introduction

1.1 Introduction

This report provides an overview of the *2002-2003 American Academy of Religion Survey of Graduate Programs in Religion and Theology*, examining each variable in the main questionnaire by departmental size.

The variable for departmental size (depsize) was constructed from the the questionnaire item measuring total funds allocated to the department (dep-funds). As can be seen in the below table, there are natural “breaks” in the frequency distribution and respondents to the departmental funds question fell into three categories: Less than \$250,00, \$1 Million to \$2.4 Million, and \$3 Million or More. These ranges were used to construct departmental size categories of “Small,” “Medium,” and “Large” departments.
